Small Group Bible Study: John 1:1-18

Open It: Icebreaker Question: If you could write a book about any subject, what would it be and why?

Dig Into It:

- 1. John 1:1-2 presents the Word as eternal and divine. How does this truth relate to other descriptions of Jesus in the Scriptures, such as Revelation 1:8?
- 2. In John 1:3-5, Jesus is described as the Creator and the Light. How do these descriptions align with passages like Colossians 1:16 and Psalm 27:1?
- 3. John introduces John the Baptist in verses 6-8. How does his role as a witness reflect Old Testament prophecies such as Isaiah 40:3?
- 4. Verses 9-13 describe the world's rejection of Jesus but also the power to become children of God. How do these verses resonate with passages like Isaiah 53:3 and Romans 8:14-16?
- 5. In verses 14-18, how does John describe the relationship between grace, truth, and the law? What connections can be made with Exodus 34:6 and Ephesians 2:8-9?

Reflect On It:

- 1. How does knowing Jesus as the eternal Word and Creator impact your faith and daily walk with Him?
- 2. In what ways have you encountered Jesus as the Light in your life, and how can you reflect that Light to others?

- 3. Reflecting on John the Baptist's example, how can you be a witness to the Light in your community?
- 4. Considering the offer to become children of God in verses 12-13, how has this truth shaped your identity as a believer?
- 5. How do you balance grace and truth in your own life, following the example of Jesus as described in verses 14-18?
